**ANIMAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT FOR  
APRIL 2014**

**Program Highlights**

- Volunteers donated approximately 689.50 hours in April in the areas of animal care, PEET canvassing, TNR, socialization and administration needs and several special events including a spay/neuter clinic in Rosamond and vaccine clinics in Bakersfield and Rosamond and, offsite adoption events at the Kern Scottish Society Games & Gathering and the Camelot Park Easter Trail event. With the help of our volunteers we were able to find homes for 6 dogs at the Kern Scottish Society Games & Gathering and 7 dogs and 1 cat at the Camelot Park Easter Trail event. Of the 689.50 hours, 55 of those hours were attributed to the spay/neuter clinics, vaccine clinics, and the offsite adoption events.
- April was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 48 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics including field services, the rescue of Piper the puppy, pet safety tips, operations, adoption promotions and donations for the Friends Foundation. Of those 48 contacts, 25 resulted in interviews or postings for newspaper, television and radio media outlets via video, newsprint on the news agency websites and papers and on Facebook pages.
- The Rescue Team made three trips to transport a total of 90 animals to Southern California this month. An additional 223 animals from KCAS shelters were pulled by rescue agencies for a grand total of 313 animals that were saved by rescue organizations in April.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 95 new animals entered the foster care program during the month of April.
- Starting July 1, 2013, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 140 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in April. The total number of cats that have been altered since the beginning of the program is 1118.
- A successful spay/neuter clinic was held in April in Rosamond. The Department partnered with 2<sup>nd</sup> District Supervisor Scrivner to host the event in Rosamond where 30 pets were spayed/neutered. Each of these pets also received a DHPP or FVRCP vaccination, a Rabies vaccination, and a microchip. Dogs were also issued a one year Kern County license. In addition, a low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinic took place where 46 DHPP vaccinations, 3 FVRCP vaccinations, 95 Rabies vaccinations, 130 licenses and 43 microchips were issued to residents in Rosamond. Special thanks to Dr. Darrow and Dr. Hannah for surgery and clinic services in Rosamond.
- Two successful, low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics were held in Bakersfield (Westdale Park), and Rosamond (Hummell Community Building), 243

licenses, 200 Rabies vaccinations, 144 DHPP vaccinations, 8 FVRCP vaccinations, and 101 free microchips were implanted during these vaccination clinics.

- The Department's new Wednesday evening vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinics at the new Fruitvale Shelter location in Bakersfield continued in April with 92 DHPP vaccinations, 8 FVRCP vaccinations, 135 Rabies vaccinations, 140 licenses and 77 microchips were issued during the four Wednesday evening clinics. The Department plans to continue to offer the Wednesday evening clinics on an on-going basis to assist pet owners in keeping their pets healthy and happy.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 5,942 microchips for County and City residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department's medical team was extremely busy this month performing 60 spays and 58 neuters on site for a total of 118 surgeries performed.

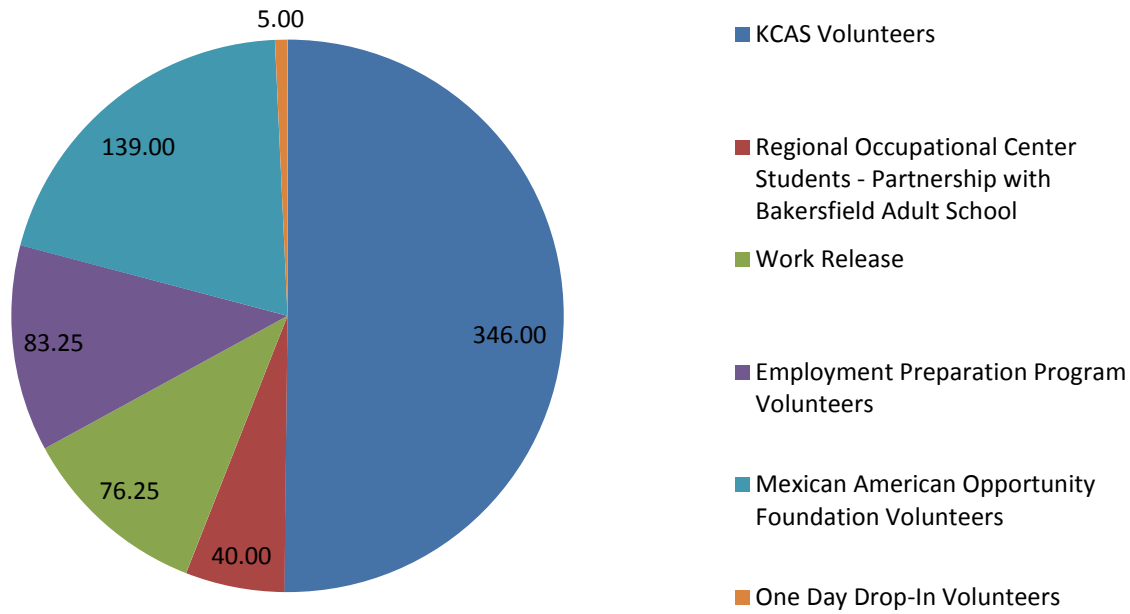
