**ANIMAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT FOR  
MAY 2014**

**Program Highlights**

- Volunteers donated approximately 960.25 hours in May in the areas of animal care, PEET canvassing, socialization and administration needs and several special events including a spay/neuter clinic in Arvin and vaccine clinics in Bakersfield and Shafter. Of the 960.25 hours, 53.50 of those hours were attributed to the spay/neuter clinic and the vaccine clinics.
- May was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 37 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics including field services, Herschel the Doberman Puppy saved by the Lacey Fund, pet safety tips, operations, adoption promotions and donations for the Friends Foundation. Of those 37 contacts, 26 resulted in interviews or postings for newspaper, television and radio media outlets via video, newsprint on the news agency websites and papers and on Facebook pages.
- The Rescue Team made three trips to transport a total of 147 animals to Northern and Southern California this month including a special transport to Mt. Shasta again. The rescue team also coordinated a rescue flight with the Wings of Rescue organization and several other agencies including Unity Thrift Rescue of Taft, Bakersfield City Animal Care and Control and, Have a Heart Humane Society of Tehachapi. These agencies worked together to send 109 dogs on three private jets to be flown to new homes waiting for them in Washington and Oregon. KCAS sent 38 dogs on this flight and the rescue team is working hard to continue this special type of transport in the future. An additional 137 animals from KCAS shelters were pulled by rescue agencies for a grand total of 322 animals that were saved by rescue organizations in May.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 79 new animals entered the foster care program during the month of May.
- Starting July 1, 2013, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 129 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in May. The total number of cats that have been altered since the beginning of the program is 1268.
- A successful spay/neuter clinic was held in May in Arvin. The Department partnered with 5<sup>th</sup> District Supervisor Leticia Perez to host the event in Arvin where 30 pets were spayed/neutered. Each of these pets also received a DHPP or FVRCP vaccination, a Rabies vaccination, and a microchip. In addition, a low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinic took place where 83 DHPP vaccinations, 6 FVRCP vaccinations, 2 Rabies vaccinations, 2 licenses and 56 microchips were issued to residents in Arvin. Special thanks to Dr. Hyman for surgery and clinic services in Arvin.

- Two successful, low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics were held in Bakersfield (Heritage Park), and Shafter (Mannel Park), 168 licenses, 187 Rabies vaccinations, 295 DHPP vaccinations, 6 FVRCP vaccinations, and 206 free microchips were implanted during these vaccination clinics.
- The Department's new Wednesday evening vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinics at the new Fruitvale Shelter location in Bakersfield continued in May with 68 DHPP vaccinations, 14 FVRCP vaccinations, 95 Rabies vaccinations, 130 licenses and 58 microchips were issued during the four Wednesday evening clinics. The Department plans to continue to offer the Wednesday evening clinics on an on-going basis to assist pet owners in keeping their pets healthy and happy.
- During the month of May, the Department hosted a special adoption promotion for cats, \$5 Feline Fridays. Every Friday in May, all available cat adoptions were reduced to just \$5. The event was well supported by the public with a total of 49 cats adopted during the 5 day event. The Department plans to bring this type of promotion back periodically during the year due to the successful outcome.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 6,386 microchips for County and City residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department's medical team was extremely busy this month performing 52 spays and 47 neuters on site for a total of 99 surgeries performed.

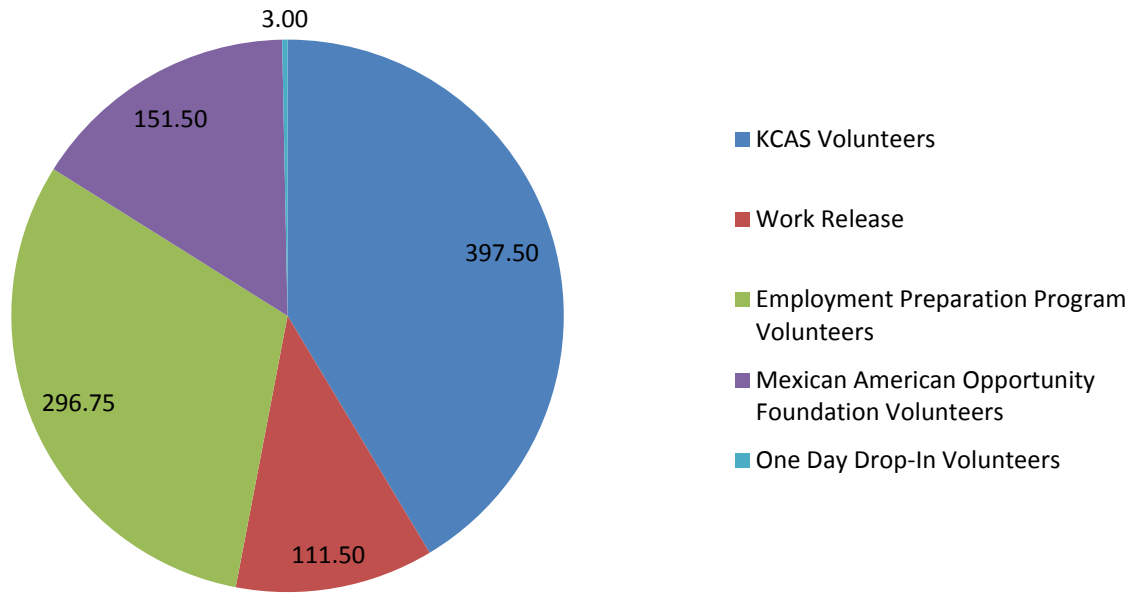
