**ANIMAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT FOR
JUNE 2014**

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 930.50 hours in June in the areas of animal care, PEET canvassing, socialization, administration needs, and several special events including vaccine clinics in Bakersfield and the Just One Day adoption event. Of the 930.50 hours, 93.25 of those hours were attributed to the vaccine clinics and the Just One Day event. Two of our volunteers went above and beyond aiding the Department in our adoption efforts by each helping to place 12 animals in forever homes.
- June was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 54 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics including field services, the Just One Day adoption event, pet safety tips, operations, and the Adopt-A-Cat month adoption event. Of those 54 contacts, 27 resulted in interviews or postings for newspaper, television and radio media outlets via video, newsprint on the news agency websites and papers and on Facebook pages.
- The Rescue Team made two trips to transport a total of 103 animals to Northern and Southern California this month including a special transport to Mt. Shasta again. An additional 94 animals from KCAS shelters were pulled by rescue agencies for a grand total of 197 animals that were saved by rescue organizations in June.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 99 new animals entered the foster care program during the month of June.
- Starting July 1, 2013, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 142 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in June. The total number of cats that have been altered since the beginning of the program is 1417.
- A successful spay/neuter clinic was held in June in Boron. The Department partnered with 2nd District Supervisor Zack Scrivner to host the event in Boron where 26 pets were spayed/neutered. Each of these pets also received a DHPP or FVRCP vaccination, a Rabies vaccination, and a microchip. In addition, a low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinic took place where 56 DHPP vaccinations, 6 FVRCP vaccinations, 47 Rabies vaccinations, 44 licenses and 41 microchips were issued to residents in the Boron area. Special thanks to Dr. Hannah for surgery and clinic services in Boron for the event.
- The Department hosted a successful, low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinic held in Bakersfield (Greenacres Park). 103 licenses, 93 Rabies vaccinations, 85 DHPP vaccinations, 6 FVRCP vaccinations, and 28 free microchips were implanted during this vaccination clinic.
- The Department's new Wednesday evening vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinics at the new Fruitvale Shelter location in Bakersfield continued in June with 71

DHPP vaccinations, 14 FVRCP vaccinations, 90 Rabies vaccinations, 92 licenses and 59 microchips were issued during the four Wednesday evening clinics. The Department plans to continue to offer the Wednesday evening clinics on an on-going basis to assist pet owners in keeping their pets healthy and happy.

- In honor of National Adopt-A-Cat month, the Department hosted a special adoption promotion for cats – every Tuesday, all cat adoption fees were reduced to just \$10. It quickly became evident that the promotion was very popular with over 50 cats adopted out in just two weeks and the public response was very supportive. As such, the Director decided to expand the promotion after the first two weeks to include a reduced fee every day until the end of June. The event was well supported by the public with a total of 132 cats adopted during the month long event. The Department plans to continue these types of promotions to help successfully place pets in forever homes in the future.
- The Department joined thousands of shelters and rescues across the country on June 11th, pledging to not euthanize any animals during the national “Just One Day” event. This is the third year in a row that the Department has participated in the national event. In addition, the Department promoted the importance of adopting pets from a shelter by hosting a special adoption promotion where adoption fees were reduced to just \$11 at all three shelter locations (Bakersfield, Lake Isabella and Mojave). The Bakersfield shelter location had extended adoption hours on this day (9 am to 8 pm) and the public was encouraged to make a difference on the 11th, for 11 hours and with \$11 to save a life. The event was a huge success with 112 adoptions taking place – Bakersfield shelter adopted 103 animals, Lake Isabella shelter adopted 8 animals and the Mojave shelter adopted 1 animal. The Department also partnered with the Friends of the Kern County Animal Shelters Foundation and Marley’s Mutts. Both organizations were at the Bakersfield shelter location – The Friends Foundation offered ID tags for purchase for both new and veteran pet owners for just \$5 for one side or \$6 for two sides; Marley’s Mutts gave away free dog food bags for each new dog adoption.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 6,587 microchips for County and City residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department’s medical team was extremely busy this month performing 57 spays and 58 neuters on site for a total of 105 surgeries performed.

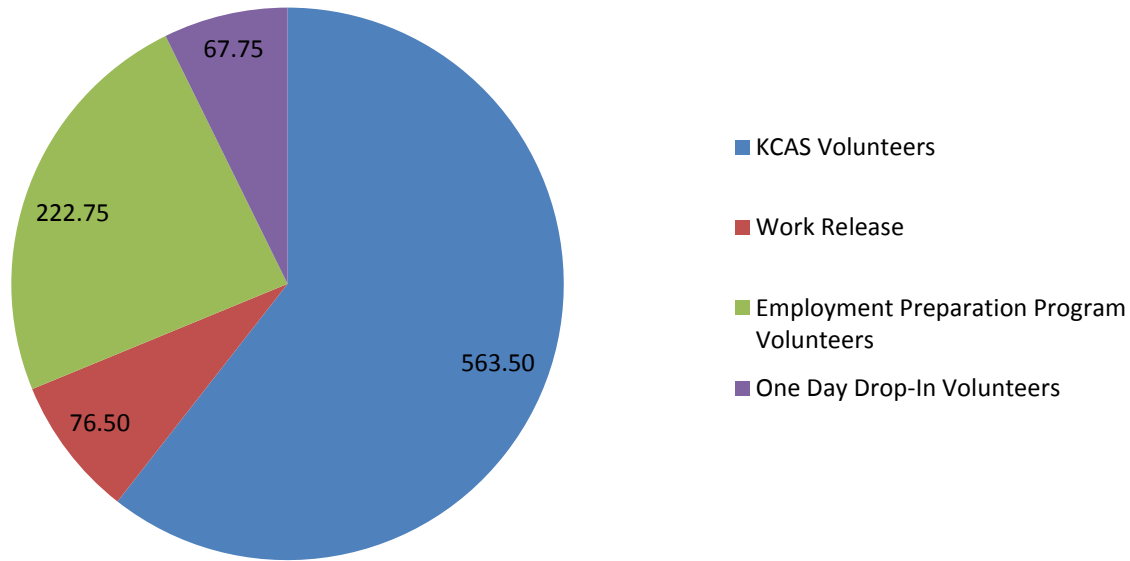
