**ANIMAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT FOR
AUGUST 2014**

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 940.75 hours in August in the areas of animal care, PEET canvassing, socialization, administration needs, grooming, cleaning, training and several special events including vaccine clinics in Bakersfield and Tehachapi. There were 85 active volunteers in August. 259.75 of the original 940.75 hours were completed by work release volunteers. Total volunteer time equates to 5.9 staff members and the value given back to KCAS by current and new volunteers in all areas is \$23, 283.56.
- August was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 45 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics such as field services including arrests and wildlife calls; Dog and Cat Days of Summer adoption promotion; vaccination clinics; spay/neuter resources; operations, and the Wings of Rescue transport. Of those 51 contacts, 22 resulted in interviews or postings for newspaper, television and radio media outlets via video, newsprint on the news agency websites and papers and on Facebook pages.
- The Department hosted its second annual Dog & Cat Days of Summer adoption promotion during the month of August. All dog adoptions were reduced to just \$15 and all cat adoptions were reduced to just \$5. The promotion was overwhelmingly supported by the community with an amazing 334 adoptions, an increase of 12% in adoptions over the prior year. The Department plans to continue this fun and life-saving promotion each summer.
- The Rescue Team made one trip to Mt. Shasta where over 40 dogs were transported after the KCAS medical team heartworm tested and health inspected each pet to ensure that they could cross over into Washington State. A special collaboration between KCAS, City of Bakersfield Animal Care Center, Unity Thrift of Taft Rescue, Wings of Rescue, Shelter Me and the Bark Avenue Foundation resulted in approximately 100 animals flying to new homes in the Pacific Northwest. KCAS sent 16 dogs on this first flight and the Department is preparing for additional flights in the future. In addition to the two transports, rescue agencies saved a grand total of 166 animals in August.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 50 new animals entered the foster care program during the month of August.
- Starting July 1, 2013, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 207 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in July. The total number of cats that have been altered since the beginning of the program is 1805.

- The Department hosted two successful, low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics in Bakersfield (Virginia Park) and Tehachapi (Meadowbrook Park). 125 licenses, 111 Rabies vaccinations, 77 DHPP vaccinations, 7 FVRCP vaccinations, and 42 free microchips were implanted during this vaccination clinic.
- The Department's new Wednesday evening vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinics at the new Fruitvale Shelter location in Bakersfield continued in August with 112 DHPP vaccinations, 32 FVRCP vaccinations, 90 Rabies vaccinations, 81 licenses and 53 microchips were issued during the four Wednesday evening clinics. The Department plans to continue to offer the Wednesday evening clinics on an on-going basis to assist pet owners in keeping their pets healthy and happy.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 6,941 microchips for County and City residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department's medical team was extremely busy this month performing 63 spays and 76 neuters on site for a total of 139 surgeries performed.

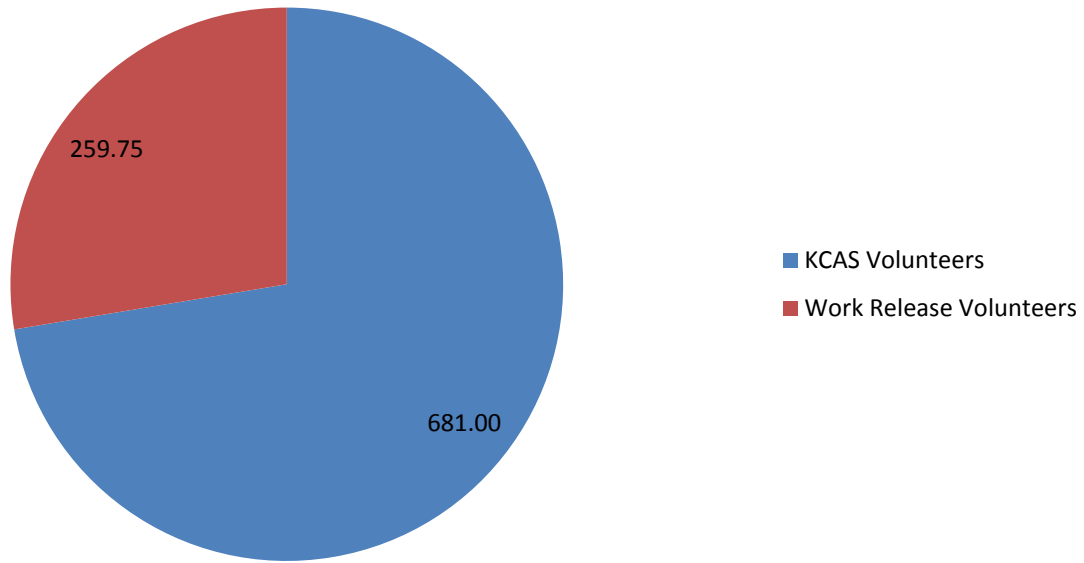
