**ANIMAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT FOR
DECEMBER 2014**

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 1068.50 hours in December in the areas of animal care, PEET canvassing, socialization, administration needs, grooming, cleaning, photography and several special events. There were 96 active volunteers in December. Of the 1068.50 original hours, 755.50 hours were completed by regular KCAS volunteers, 3.50 hours were completed by one-day volunteers, 88.50 hours were completed by employment preparation volunteers, and 221 hours were completed by work release volunteers. Total volunteer time equates to 6.6 staff members and the value given back to KCAS by current and new volunteers in all areas is \$26,445.38.
- December was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 25 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics such as field services including wildlife calls; Home 4 the Holidays adoption promotion; vaccination clinics; spay/neuter resources, senior pets plight in shelters, Lacey's Fund recipients and winter weather tips to safeguard pets. Of those 25 contacts, 15 resulted in interviews or postings for newspaper, television and radio media outlets via video, newsprint on the news agency websites and papers and, on Facebook pages.
- The Department continued its 4th Annual Home 4 the Holidays adoption promotion, in December. All dog adoption fees have been reduced to just \$20 and all cat adoption fees have been reduced to just \$10. The event has been very successful in the first two months with a total of 654 animals finding their forever homes. The promotion runs through January 10, 2015.
- The Rescue Team made a trip to Mt. Shasta and Emeryville during the month of December, resulting in 102 animals finding new forever homes. In addition to the two transports to Northern California, rescue partners saved a grand total of 143 animals in December.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 30 new animals entered the foster care program during the month of December.
- Starting July 1, 2013, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 108 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in December. The total number of cats that have been altered since the beginning of the program is 2540.
- The Department was invited once again to participate in the Bakersfield Christmas Parade as a vendor and new this year, the Department had a float entry. Staff and volunteers set-up two booth locations to engage the public and adopt out dogs. The Kern County Animal Services Pet Adoption Centers were a huge hit with residents that stopped by to check out the available pets and speak with staff and volunteers about responsible pet ownership and the services that the Department provides. 4 dogs found

their forever homes at this event, thanks to the dedication of staff and volunteers. Staff and volunteers also worked tirelessly to create a specially decorated gingerbread dog house float for the entry. Staff, volunteers and, Sammy the Saint Bernard, rode on the float or walked behind the float with dogs that had been rescued to help bring Christmas cheer and awareness of the plight of homeless pets to the spectators. A total of 9 staff and 13 volunteers braved the cold night to make this another successful event.

- The NOR Christmas Parade also invited the Department to participate again as an entry in their Christmas parade. 5 staff along with 9 volunteers, dressed warmly in festive attire, along with a number of adopted dogs also dressed in festive attire, walked the parade route waving to the crowd and encouraging them to adopt from our shelters. In addition, Sammy the Saint Bernard was in attendance again to the delight of the crowd, both young and old.
- KCAS hosted two successful, low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics in Buttonwillow (Buttonwillow Park) and Bakersfield (Kern County Animal Services – Bakersfield Shelter). 102 licenses, 98 Rabies vaccinations, 74 DHPP vaccinations, 2 FVRCP vaccinations, and 46 free microchips were implanted during these vaccination clinics.
- The Department's new Wednesday evening vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinics at the new Fruitvale Shelter location in Bakersfield continued in December with 102 DHPP vaccinations, 14 FVRCP vaccinations, 93 Rabies vaccinations, 80 licenses and 72 microchips issued during the three Wednesday evening clinics. The Department plans to continue to offer the Wednesday evening clinics on an on-going basis to assist pet owners in keeping their pets healthy and happy.
- In December, the Department partnered with 1st District Supervisor Mick Gleason and the Kern County Parks & Recreation Department to provide spay/neuter surgeries to residents in the Lake Isabella and Kern River Valley areas. 25 animals were spayed or neutered during this event. Special thanks to Dr. Willis and his mobile veterinary team from San Joaquin Veterinary Hospital for performing the surgeries. The Department will continue partnering with additional agencies and the Board of Supervisor members to bring spay/neuter services to as many unincorporated residents as possible.
- KCAS hosted three Sunday adoption events at the PetSmart store, located on Oswell in Bakersfield, in December. Staff showcased a number of adoptable dogs during the events and were successfully able to adopt out a total of 6 dogs.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 7,756 microchips for Kern County residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department's medical team was extremely busy this month performing 57 spays and 63 neuters on site for a total of 120 surgeries performed.

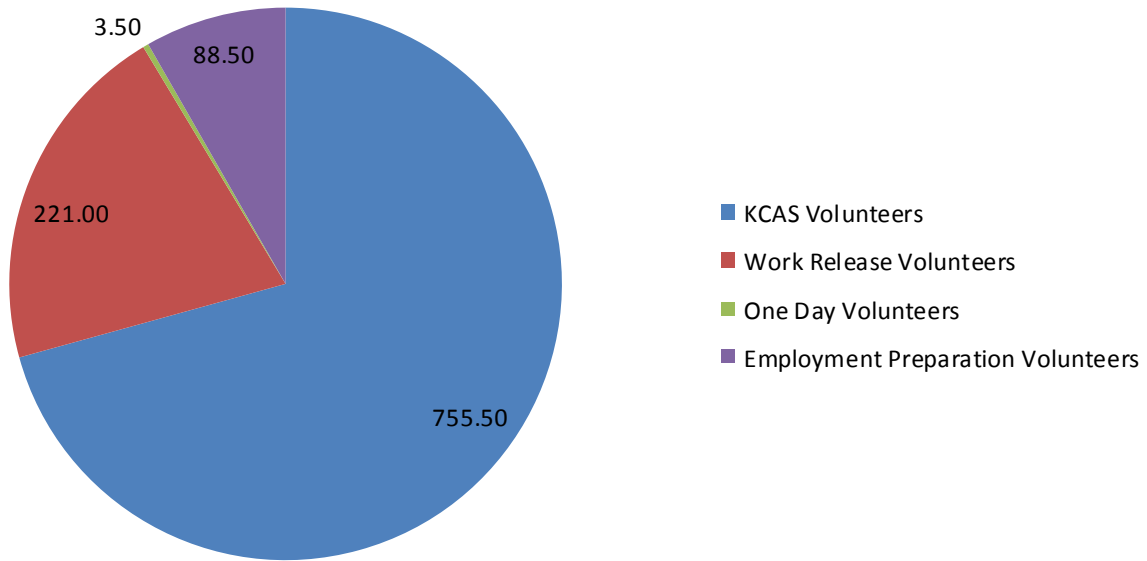
