ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR JULY 2010

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 221.5 hours in the areas of veterinary medical care, shelter office support, adoption center assistance, exercising, grooming, and off-site adoptions. One off-site event was held this month and accounted for 28.5 hours of the 221.5 volunteer time. Two dogs were adopted out as a result of these two events. Low volunteer hours were attributed to volunteer vacations and requests for time-off.
- The Marketing & Promotions Associate gave an education presentation at the Mercy Childcare Center. Approximately, 25 students received information on responsible pet ownership, spaying and neutering pets, vaccinating and licensing dogs and information on animal control services.
- An Animal Control Officer and the Marketing and Promotions Associate participated in the Bakersfield SPCA's Summer Day Camp for kids. Staff attended two sessions and provided approximately 35 children with information on responsible pet ownership, spaying and neutering pets, vaccinating and licensing dogs and information on animal control services..
- Division staff teamed up with the Humane Society of the United States to help remove over 144 dogs from a property in Tehachapi. The dogs were transferred to the Sacramento Humane Society and from there were rescued and adopted out.
- Animal Control Officers, the Director and the Marketing and Promotions Associate brought cages, carriers and supplies to the evacuation centers in Lake Isabella and Tehachapi during the Bull and West fires. Animal Control Officers also assisted the Fire Department with abandoned animals and also patrolled the fire areas for lost animals.
- **The new Public Education and Enforcement Team personnel completed their sixth full month of canvassing in the unincorporated area of the county.**
 - 963 properties were surveyed.
 - 356 Courtesy Notices were issued for dogs not having a current rabies vaccination or current dog license.
