### **ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR February 2011**

#### **Program Highlights**

- Volunteers donated approximately 621.25 hours in February in the areas of veterinary medical care, shelter office support, adoption center assistance, grooming, and off-site adoptions at Petco. Two off-site events were held in February and accounted for 63 hours of the 621.5 total volunteer hours. Five dogs were adopted out as a result of these events.
- Officer Fred May was selected to be the Grand Marshal of the 2011 Whiskey Flat Days Parade. Division Manager Kimberly Mullins joined Officer May along with several furry friends looking for new homes on the Animal Control float. Special thanks to the Health Promotions & Public Information team members that assisted in decorating the float.
- The Division participated in the National Spay Day USA event sponsored by the Humane Society of the United States. This national event seeks to raise the importance and awareness of spaying and neutering companion animals by focusing on three areas: fundraising, performing spay/neuter surgeries and education. The department concentrated on the education portion of the event by partnering with KBAK TV 29 for a live remote from the adoption center to reach viewers about the importance of spaying/neutering companion animals.
- The Marketing & Promotions Associate is working closely with the Kern County Library staff to roll out a new education program, thanks to a \$75,000 grant, to educate school children and their parents in the outlying areas by promoting responsible pet ownership and the importance of utilizing the library as a tool for more information on pets and pet ownership.
- Two successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Bakersfield. 253 licenses, 239 Rabies vaccinations and 151 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
