ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
June 2011

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 365 hours in June in the areas of veterinary medical care, shelter office support, adoption center assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. One off-site event was held at PETCO, for a total of 29.5 hours of the original 365 volunteer hours. Two dogs were adopted out as a result of this event.
- The Division began the second phase of the Paws & Claws program with the Kern County Library. Kern County Library Staff along with the Marketing & Promotions Associate, volunteer, animal control officers, animal care workers and the shelter supervisor attended four special events at libraries in Arvin, Taft, Ridgecrest and Oildale. These events featured animals available for adoption, pet related guest speakers addressing topics such as the importance of spaying/neutering, disaster preparedness, low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics and animal control services in general. Each event also showcased the many wonderful books available from the library on pet related topics. More events are planned for July and August. Two dogs and two cats were adopted at these events.
- June was Adopt-A-Cat Month and the Division celebrated this national month by hosting the "Take My Buddy Home Too! Program. This program encouraged feline lovers to come to any of the three shelters and adopt one cat and take home a feline friend at no additional fee. The Friends of the Kern County Animal Shelters Foundation financially supported the efforts of the Division by offering to reimburse the Division \$25 per cat adopted, up to \$1000. As a result of this successful partnership, 65 cats were adopted during the month.
- The Marketing & Promotions Associate was a guest on the To Your Health Program. Information was presented on staying healthy and active with your pet and how to adopt from the shelter.
- Three successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Bakersfield, Mojave and Frazier Park. 139 licenses, 127 Rabies vaccinations and 154 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
