ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
July 2011

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 259.25 hours in July in the areas of veterinary medical care, shelter office support, adoption center assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. One off-site event was held at PETCO, for a total of 37.5 hours of the original 259.25 volunteer hours. Three dogs were adopted out as a result of this event.
- The Division continued its participation in the Paws & Claws program with the Kern County Library. Kern County Library Staff along with the Marketing & Promotions Associate, volunteer, animal control officers, and animal care workers attended three special events at libraries in Frazier Park, Tehachapi and Mojave. These events featured animals available for adoption, pet related guest speakers addressing topics such as the importance of spaying/neutering, disaster preparedness, low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics and animal control services in general. Each event also showcased the many wonderful books available from the library on pet related topics. The final two events are scheduled for Rosamond and Bakersfield. Three dogs and three cats were adopted at these events.
- An animal control officer participated in three educational sessions at the Bakersfield SPCA's Summer Day Camp for kids. Children in attendance were provided with information on responsible pet ownership, including spaying and neutering pets, vaccinating and licensing dogs and information on the day-to-day job duties of animal control officers.
- Three successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Bakersfield and Shafter. 156 licenses, 573 Rabies vaccinations and 450 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
