ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
September 2011

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 251 hours in September in the areas of veterinary medical care, shelter office support, adoption center assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. One off-site event was held at PETCO, for a total of 27.75 hours of the original 251 volunteer hours. One dog was adopted out as a result of this event.
- The Division was called upon to play key roles in setting up animal shelters and with evacuation assistance during two fires: Canyon and Comanche/Keene Complex fires. Animal Control Officers were deployed to provide supplies and assistance to residents affected by the evacuation notices and, the Marketing & Promotions Associate helped staff the Joint Information Center at the EOC to assist with information dissemination to the public.
- The Division was approved for a two-year, \$117,000 targeted feral/free roaming cat grant from PetSmart Charities®. The targeted area grant will focus on spaying and neutering feral and free roaming cats in the 93306 zip code area. The Division has partnered with The Friends of the Kern County Animal Shelters Foundation, Orphan Kitten Rescue & Adoption (OKRA), AngelDogs Foundation, and The Cat People to recruit, train and coordinate volunteers within the community to assist with setting traps, transporting cats to and from the clinics and data collection and entry. The goal of the grant is to humanely manage feral/free roaming cat populations to reduce the number of cats born into each area over time and eventually see a reduction in the numbers in the community and entering the shelter.
- Three successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in two locations in Bakersfield and one location in Lamont. 102 licenses, 341 Rabies vaccinations and 135 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
