ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
January 2012

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 326.25 hours in January in the areas of shelter office support, medical assistance, adoption center assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. Two off-site adoption events were held at PETCO for a total of 61 hours of the original 326.25 volunteer hours. Eight dogs were adopted out as a result of these events.
- The Happy Kern Cats PetSmart Charities® Grant to fund free spaying/neutering of feral and free-roaming cats in the 93306 area continued with two more successful clinics in January. The first clinic resulted in 69 cats spayed or neutered. The second clinic day resulted in 61 cats spayed or neutered, for a grand total of 417 cats altered since the program began in November. Two more dates are scheduled for February. The program continues to grow and remain successful due to the overwhelming support from the public through volunteers and community organizations.
- Staff made several trips to both Northern and Southern California to transport dogs and cats to rescues in those areas. Approximately 130 animals received new homes due to the transports by staff. In addition, a special international rescue transport was also coordinated and 11 cats were once again driven to a rescue in British Columbia, Canada by volunteers.
- Over 200 animals were rescued from a property in Rosamond. The animals were brought to the Kern County Fairgrounds and to the Kern County Animal Control shelter to receive medical treatment and basic needs. Kern County Animal Control staff along with the Bakersfield SPCA and the Humane Society of the United States and dozens of caring and interested citizen volunteers coordinated efforts to ensure that all animals including dogs, cats, horses, ducks, chickens and one pig received the attention and care they deserved. Over 130 animals have already been placed with rescues. Many of the animals were passengers on the several transports to Northern and Southern California with the shelter animals. Kern County Animal Control staff continues to work closely with rescues to find placement for the remaining animals.
- Two successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Bakersfield. 294 licenses, 246 Rabies vaccinations and 134 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
