ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
February 2012

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 337.75 hours in February in the areas of shelter office support, medical assistance, adoption center assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. Two off-site adoption events were held at PETCO for a total of 60 hours of the original 337.75 volunteer hours. Five dogs were adopted out as a result of these events.
- The Happy Kern Cats PetSmart Charities® Grant to fund free spaying/neutering of feral and free-roaming cats in the 93306 area continued with two more successful clinics in February. The first clinic resulted in 67 cats spayed or neutered. The second clinic day resulted in 57 cats spayed or neutered, for a grand total of 540 cats altered since the program began in November. Two more dates are scheduled for March. The community support continues to be positive and growing as program partners, staff and volunteers anticipate future successes.
- Staff made five trips to both Northern and Southern California to transport dogs and cats to rescues in those areas. Approximately 250 animals received new homes due to the transports by staff.
- The Marketing & Promotions Associate was a guest on the *To Your Health* program. Topics covered included responsible pet ownership, the importance of adopting from a shelter and how pets can physically enhance a life through health benefits.
- The Animal Care Program Specialist was a featured speaker on KGET 17's segment on the dangers of Parvo and preventative maintenance to keep dogs healthy.
- Staff, volunteers and the public came together for an inaugural GO MAD (Make A Difference) Event for KCAC's adoptable animals. Approximately 85 members of the public came out to help dogs and cats get dressed up and to be photographed by a professional photographer. Better photos make for more adoptions and the animals were shared all over Facebook to increase their chances of adoption and rescue. 9 adoptions took place that day with another 10 adoption interests placed. Future events are in the works to continue the community collaboration.
- Two successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Bakersfield. 312 licenses, 408 Rabies vaccinations and 275 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
