**ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR**  
**May 2012**

**Program Highlights**

- Volunteers donated approximately 546.25 hours in May in the areas of shelter office support, adoption center assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. Four off-site volunteer adoption events were held this month at PETCO, the Chase Bank Pet Adoption Fair and the second Go Mad event. Volunteer hours for these events totaled 85.25 hours of the original 546.25 volunteer hours. Volunteers assisted in finding homes for 18 dogs and 1 cat this month.
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> Go MAD (Make A Difference) event was successfully held for KCAC's adoptable animals. Approximately 50 members of the public and a number of volunteers participated during the day to assist with photographing animals for adoption. Cute and cuddly photos were taken and shared on Facebook to increase their chances of adoption and rescue. 7 adoptions took place that day and a dozen adoption interests were placed. Over 40 animals were photographed that day and just a few are still waiting for adoption or rescue.
- The Happy Kern Cats PetSmart Charities® Grant to fund free spaying/neutering of feral and free-roaming cats in the targeted 93306 area continued with three more successful clinics in May. The total number of cats spayed or neutered since the program began in November 2011 is now 888. Two more dates are scheduled for June.
- Staff made four trips to transport dogs and cats to rescues in Simi Valley, Emeryville, Santa Cruz and Porterville. Approximately 160 animals received new homes due to the transports by staff this month.
- Two successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Shafter and Bakersfield. 266 licenses, 605 Rabies vaccinations and 418 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
- In addition to the regular volunteer off-site adoption events, KCAC staff participated in an additional off-site adoption event at PETCO in Bakersfield and in Simi Valley where a total of 13 dogs were adopted.
