ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
June 2012

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 681.5 hours in June in the areas of shelter office support, adoption center assistance, medical assistance, grooming, cleaning assistance and off-site adoption events. One off-site adoption event was held at PETCO for a total of 27 of the original 681.5 volunteer hours. Unfortunately, no dogs were adopted at this event, however, educational information on spaying/neutering, responsible pet ownership and the joys of adopting a pet were provided to the public.
- The Happy Kern Cats PetSmart Charities® Grant to fund free spaying/neutering of feral and free-roaming cats in the targeted 93306 area continued with two more successful clinics in June. Due to the continued dedication and devotion of our volunteer and community partners, the program reached a milestone with 1030 cats being altered since the program began in November of 2011. Two more dates are scheduled for July.
- Staff made one trip to transport dogs and cats to a rescue in Castaic. Approximately 20 animals received new homes due to the transport by staff this month.
- KCAC participated in its inaugural “Just One Day” event. The event encourages shelters across the country to pledge to make a difference in the lives of adoptable animals by showcasing pets for adoption, extending hours to the public and not euthanizing animals. KCAC promoted the event and encouraged the public to partner with staff and volunteers to make a difference in the lives of adoptable pets on June 11th, for 11 hours and with just \$11. The adoption center in Bakersfield was open from 9 am to 8 pm. All three shelter locations participated in the event and it was a huge success with the final count reaching 100 animals adopted.
- June was Adopt-A-Cat Month and KCAC celebrated the month by reducing all cat adoption fees to just \$10 for the whole month. The promotion was welcomed by the public and many families took advantage of the great deal by adopting more than one cat into their family. The final count was over 100 cats adopted as there were a number of cats that received the \$10 discount into the first few days of July.
- Three successful low-cost vaccination and licensing clinics were held in Bakersfield. 594 licenses, 579 Rabies vaccinations and 467 DHPP vaccinations were administered at these clinics.
