**ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR
SEPTEMBER 2013**

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 475.25 hours in September in the areas of shelter office support, adoption assistance, kennel/cage cleaning, photography, and grooming.
- September was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 79 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics including field services, pet safety tips, special events and the eviction and move from the Mt. Vernon facility. Of those 79 contacts, 13 resulted in interviews for newspaper, television and radio media outlets. A press conference to dispel myths about mass euthanasia along with a media day for the move was also held.
- The Rescue Team made two trips to transport animals to Northern and Southern California during the month. 65 animals found new homes due to the transports by rescue staff this month. Overall 331 animals were saved by rescue organizations in September.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 50 animals were in foster care during the month of September.
- Starting July 1st, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 97 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in September. The public continues to be supportive and helpful as the Department transitions away from the catch and kill model to a more humane approach to saving lives.
- Two successful low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics were held in Bakersfield (Heritage Park) and Frazier Park (Frazier Mountain Park). 256 licenses, 132 Rabies vaccinations, 181 DHPP vaccinations and 4 FVRCP vaccinations were administered at these clinics. A total of 91 free microchips were implanted during these two vaccination clinics.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 4,218 microchips for County and City residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department's medical team was extremely busy this month performing 52 spays and 52 neuters on site to help 104 new pets be able to go home with their forever families.
