ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION MONTHLY REPORT FOR OCTOBER 2013

Program Highlights

- Volunteers donated approximately 313.75 hours in October in the areas of shelter office support, adoption assistance, kennel/cage cleaning, photography, grooming and two offsite adoption events. Of the 313.75 hours, 17 of those hours were attributed to the offsite adoption events which resulted in two dogs being adopted.
- October was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 33 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics including field services, pet safety tips, department move, special meetings, operational changes, adoption promos, Piney the Cat and a problem solvers panel. Of those 33 contacts, 11 resulted in interviews for newspaper, television and radio media outlets, including a live remote with KBAK29 for the Howlin' for Homes Adoption Promotion and a special story regarding Piney the Cat who was stuck in a tree for nearly two weeks and was rescued by a Good Samaritan M & S Security Services and Animal Services' staff. Piney's story was a viral sensation as the story moved through the internet and was also a topic on several talk radio shows and was also featured on 23ABC and KBAK29. The Shelter Supervisor and a Senior Animal Control Officer were also part of KBAK29's Problem Solvers panel; fielding calls from the public about disaster preparedness and response, and how to ensure pets are prepared.
- Due to the transition with the move, the Rescue Team refocused their life-saving efforts on matching rescues with available animals in need. A total of 95 animals were saved by rescue organizations in October.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 64 animals entered the foster care program during the month of October.
- Starting July 1st, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 88 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in October. The public continues to be supportive and helpful as the Department transitions away from the catch and kill model to a more humane approach to saving lives.

- The Department held its 3rd Annual Howlin' for Homes Adoption Promotion where adoption fees for dogs and cats were reduced for the entire month of October. The public was encouraged to visit any of the three shelters (Bakersfield, Mojave and Lake Isabella) to adopt a dog for just \$15 and a cat for just \$5. The event was very successful with a total of 419 pets adopted this month, which was about a 9% increase over the same time period as the previous year. The Department is looking forward to the next adoption promotion which is the 3rd Annual Home 4 the Holidays promotion starting on November 1st and running through January 4th.
- Three successful low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics were held in Bakersfield (Mill Creek), Mojave (Kern County Animal Services Shelter) and, Oildale (North Meadows Park). 189 licenses, 191 Rabies vaccinations, 172 DHPP vaccinations and 11 FVRCP vaccinations were administered at these clinics. A total of 90 free microchips were implanted during these three vaccination clinics.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 4,346 microchips for County and City residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- Due to the transition with the move and the mobile unit undergoing maintenance, the
 Department's medical team refocused their efforts to ensure that any medical needs
 were met and that the animals were settling into their new home with as little stress as
 possible.
